Dr. Bell obtained her medical degree from Albany Medical College, Albany, NY. She completed anatomic pathology residency at New York University Medical Center, NY and a fellowship in Cytopathology at Memorial Sloan-Kettering Cancer Center, NY. She has been a faculty at Massachusetts General Hospital and Harvard for 25 years. Currently she is a Consultant and a Professor in Laboratory Medicine and Pathology, College of Medicine, Mayo Clinic.  
Dr. Bell prides herself to be trained by Dr. Robert Scully. She is co-authoring the new AFIP fascicle on "Tumors of the Ovary and Fallopian Tube." She was on the subcommittee of the International Society of Gynecologic Pathologists that established the criteria for the new WHO book on this subject, and coauthored several chapters in the WHO book published in 2014.
